Helping Children and Young People Learn

When families and schools work together, children are more likely to build good relationships and do better at school.

Tip 6: Support Good Relationships

Parents can help children develop friendships and get along with other people, including their teacher.

Children tend to do better when they get on with their teacher and classmates. Children also tend to enjoy learning and being at school when they have strong friendships.

Be positive about school and respectful of teachers

Help your child to build and maintain a positive relationship with their teacher.

Support good relationships with friends and classmates.

Skills that help friendships include cooperation, communication, empathy and emotional control.

How they respond to any problems they are having

Their ideas for resolving conflict positively

Ask for advice from teachers and school staff
