At Peterborough Primary, each week, students participate in The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC). The program promotes respectful relationships and a child safety curriculum that teaches all children and young people they have the right to be safe and they can help themselves to be safe by talking to people they trust.

In the next two weeks students will be identifying trusted adults, to then invite them to be on their network. A note will be coming home during the week with people your child has chosen to be on their network.

Please talk to your child about the people on their network.

If you are concerned about any of the people on the network, or people who have been omitted, it is important to remember that it is the child's selection.

We suggest that it is important to review networks regularly with your child as members of the network may change for a variety of reasons.
