Dear Families

It was lovely to have so many families join us for our meet and greet last Wednesday and have the opportunity to share what is happening around the school and in the classes. We had most families make appointments to discuss their child's/children's learning at an appropriate time with teachers. A key focus of our **Site Improvement Plan** is **reading**. This is an area where you can easily support your child through listening to them read. Read books, a recipe or even the supermarket advertisement. The more they read the better they get. An empowering **movie** to watch that highlights the impact of reading is '**Gifted Hands -The Ben Carson story**'. Set a goal to **read every day** before they use Technology or watch TV. Reading is a key component in learning progress across all subject areas. This is evident in especially writing with the development of story and maths for clearly understanding what is being asked in questions.

A group of students attended the completion of the new roof on the Roundhouse as part of the 'Silver to Sea Way' project and had a tour of the works by the site foreman explaining the work that was completed and the challenges of working with such an old building. It will be great to be able to take the whole school to visit when it re-opens.



The idea was, we are many learning together as one! I have stitched all the squares together to make a quilt.


This quilt is now displayed in the front office, so please come in to see your child's artistic contribution sometime.
